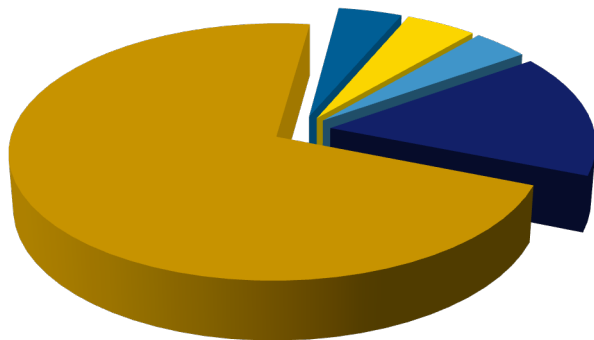
The CAP 1 Preservation Portfolio is designed primarily for principal protection over market cycles. Portfolio allocations range between 80% and 90% in Cash and Bonds with a small segment allocated to Stocks for diversification.

WHAT DOES THE FUND INVEST IN?

The CAP 1 Preservation portfolio invests in several underlying Fixed Income mutual funds to provide primarily Income and several Equity mutual funds to provide primarily Growth. Currently this portfolio is comprised of 10 underlying mutual funds that are managed by several well-regarded investment management firms and portfolio management teams.

The charts below give you a snapshot of the underlying portfolio's investments on March 31, 2024. Please note that the portfolio's investments can and will change over time.

Who Should Invest in a CAP 1 Portfolio?

The value of the portfolio can go down as well as up. You could lose money. One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a portfolio's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, portfolios with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Portfolios with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk Rating

Open Access Ltd. has rated the volatility of this portfolio as **Low**. This rating is based on how much the portfolio's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the portfolio will be in the future. The risk rating can change over time. A portfolio with a Low risk rating can still lose money.
